Pupil Premium Funding 2017/18 academic year – October 2017

At Horninglow Primary School: a de Ferrers Trust Academy, we are committed to raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

With the Pupil Premium Grant we aim to:

- provide targeted support to raise attainment in reading, writing and mathematics;
- develop self-esteem to raise confidence and aspirations of pupils;
- ensure pupils basic needs (diet and clothing) are met;
- support disadvantaged families with the cost of school expenses;
- engage with parents and support learning at home.

Currently there are 224 children on roll (including Nursery) in school, 72 of these children are Pupil Premium which equates to 32%.

**Key objectives 2017/2018**

Our key objectives in relation to spending the Pupil Premium funding for the academic year 2017/2018 are as follows:

- To set challenging targets for disadvantaged pupils to reach the national expected standard at the end of each Key Stage: EYFS, Key Stage 1, and Key Stage 2 and including the Phonics screening test at the end of Year 1 .
- To provide targeted support in reading, writing and mathematics where there is a significant gap between disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged pupils.

- Increase the attendance of PP pupils with a focus on persistent absence of less than 85%.
- Overcoming the learning barriers for those pupils who are disadvantaged through targeted support from the Pupil/Family Support Workers.
- Maximising the engagement and readiness to learn for all pupils.
- Ensure disadvantaged pupils can participate in school trips and residential visits.

From September 2017, two Family Support/Pupil Support workers have been appointed. They will focus on the following:

- To improve communications with parents.
- Provide necessary support to parents to access the skills to help their children.
- To support and guide parents to help pupils improve Maths and English skills.
- Encourage a healthy lifestyle.
- Create a whole school approach on healthy living.
- To improve emotional wellbeing of the pupils.
- To promote positive behaviour in the home by supporting parents.
- To work with parents and children to improve attendance.

Use of funding for the Academic Year 2017/2018

- Provide breakfast club provision to enable children to arrive at school on time.
- Proportion of Teaching Assistant salaries to deliver intervention work.
- Resources to deliver intervention work.
- After-school enrichment activities.
- Enrichment activities - themed days, visitors in school, educational visits.
- Family support/pupil support workers salaries (see above).
